MEETING MINUTES

February 17, 2007

The meeting of Division 1 at the Youngstown Railroad Club was called to order by Superintendent David Hazlett at 2 p.m. Twenty-one people were in attendance. Minutes of the January meeting were accepted as printed. The Treasurer's report was accepted subject to audit.

Superintendent Hazlett reported that the membership is at 107. As always, we are in need of column authors for the Peddler Freight as well as for single articles for the Peddler Freight. The need for a clerk was discussed.

The next meeting is at Don Bonk's in Louisville and is on the 30th. This late date is due to the Kirtland Show and Easter. This date was previously passed by a vote of members at the January meeting.

Bob Ashley, Chairman of Modules and Clothing, gave a report on the clothing sales to date. Orders for shirts, hats (which are available at meetings) and patches (also always available) are to be sent to Bob Ashley on the order forms provided in the February Peddler Freight. Bob also discussed the current achievements with the modules. He is disappointed in the actual response to modules, which is very minimal at this time. Again, contact Bob Ashley if you are interested in creating a module or just learning what they are all about.

Bill Smith, Treasurer and Editor, gave a report on building sales. All current buildings have been sold. Orders will be taken by Bill, so contact him if you wish to purchase a building. It was suggested that this be done soon as the buildings are a limited production.

An Elections Committee was appointed. Only one member volunteered, Frank Williamson.

Superintendent Hazlett mentioned that an article supporting model railroading, Division 1 and his layout was published on March 17 in several local newspapers including those distributed in Tallmadge, Hudson and other towns in the area.

Under Business it was decided that a sign-in sheet be used at each meeting to verify attendance numbers. This sheet will not be published.

Discussion concerning how to increase membership and attendance in and from the "East Side" of Division 1 was held. It was pointed out that the January meeting at Sebring and today's meeting in Youngstown were for that purpose. This discussion lead to an idea to promote Division 1 at railroad shows. Jim Pope offered a part of the Youngstown Railroad Club's table at their railroad show on March 9th. When volunteers were requested to man the table, only Bob Ashley volunteered.

Bob Ashley informed the group of changes in the CVSR schedule for 2008. Five days per week you will be able to travel from Rockside to Akron and then on to Canton for about \$15 per person.

The meeting was adjourned at 3:10 p.m. Contest results are to be reported in the March Peddler Freight.

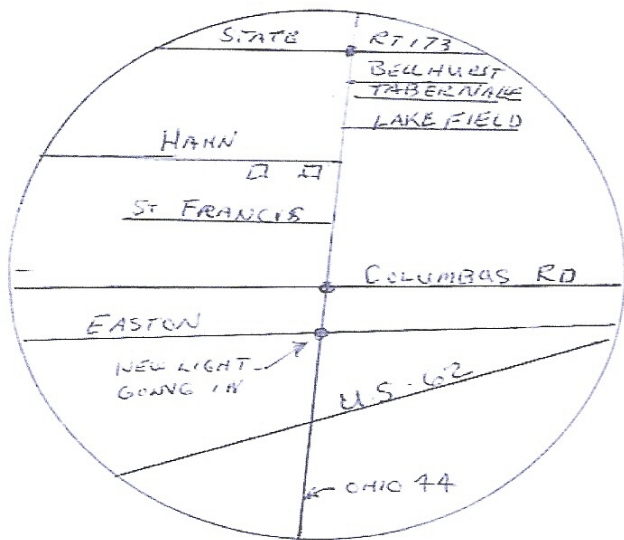
MARCH DESTINATIONS SUNDAY MARCH 30, 2008 LOUISVILLE, OHIO

N-Scale News and Views

In January I was in the train room working on an N-scale freight car at my work bench. When I'm doing some maintenance on some rolling stock, I like to have a lot of light to see what I'm doing. On my work bench under the top shelf, I have a small florescent light to help light up the area to see better. Sometimes I even put up clamp lights if I need some more light to help me see. When you get up in years you can use all the light you can get a hold of to help you see. It just doesn't seem to be enough light or it's not in the right place. I like to move things around in the work area, and when I do, the light always seems to be in the wrong place for what I'm doing. So, I always have to adjust the lights to see better. After doing this over and over again, I said to myself, there has to be a better way! I know that they sell a cap that has some LEDS on the end of the bill, putting the light where you need it. I thought about the cap, however, I don't wear a hat that much and didn't think that I would like it. Also, they have a set of glasses with LEDS, however, I already wear glasses and didn't want to wear two pair.

Then one day, while at the mall, we went into the Sears tool department. (Guys and Tools, just go together.) As we were walking around, I found just what the doctor ordered to take care of the light problem that I have. Sears sells LED anywhere clip on lights. These are so cool; they have alligator style clips and also have a magnetic base on the clips. If you want to put them on a cap, you can. If you want to use them on your glasses you can. It will put the light where you need and want it. They even come with a small nylon zipper

case to store them when you're not using them. The LEDS are very bright for whatever you may want to use them for. You can find them in the Tool Department at Sears, # 34-93340. *LED Lighted Anywhere Clip-Ons*. These are a definite must for us N-Scalers and our tiny rolling stock, engines, etc. They also would be good for those who model any scale who want to shed a lot of light on the subject!

MODULE REPORT



The MODULE CLINIC was conducted at the January meeting held at the Sebring Model Railroad Club. We had a partially built Division 1 module to show the details that are in the construction. There were 11 handouts retained by those present. The handouts summarized the HO, N AND Z Gauge types of modules and provided information to obtain construction details for those who wish to make a module(s). There is interest in making modules that can be shown at the Berea Carnival in October, joining with Division 4's modules.

Building a module is rather simple and, working together, several can be built quickly. The module can then be taken home for detailing by the owner.

We have not set a date for constructing modules, yet, due to the lack of response. We had a unanimous response at the meeting at the Whistle Stop to pursue the project, but, only three members have said they want to do this. Please let me know if you will participate. I will schedule a Building Session at my home, probably on a Sunday afternoon, as soon as we get a few more names. If you want a module, but, you can't attend a Building Session, we can build one for you as long as you are willing to pay for the materials.

We can't price the materials yet due to the lack of response. We need some quantities to help lower the price.

HO gauge specs can be downloaded by logging on to Division 4's website at <http://www.div4.org>. Scroll down to MODULE SPECS and print the HO module instructions. The specs for N gauge can be found at <http://www.ntrak.org>. These inexpensive specs must be ordered from the NTRAK organization. The Z gauge specs are called Z-BEND TRACK and can be downloaded by logging on to their website at <http://www.zbendtrack.com/> and clicking on PDF Z-BEND TRACK STANDARDS. All these specs are meeting the NMRA standards or are in committee for approval.
