

Larry: Well, I'm sure gonna vote, Rivets, you can count on that!



MEMBER PROFILES David Greer



Dave lives at 2021 Parasol Drive in Lexington with his wife Rita and son Jonathan. Dave's originally from upstate New York but has lived in Lexington since the mid-70s. He is an engineer for Lexmark International, Inc.

Dave has been a model railroader for as long as he can remember. His father is responsible for his early interest in trains, having built a layout before David was born. Dave got his first layout, an HO loop and a spur on green plywood, for his fourth Christmas. Due to space constraints, Dave switched to N-scale in the early 70's. N-scale equipment at the time did not run very well; however, the compact size allowed him to have more exciting track plans on his 4 by 6 layout table. Much has changed since then; his N-scale layout has grown to 10 by 14 with further expansion in the plans. Dave is the CEO of the Durham, Oakhill, and Ohio RR (Doo Line for short.) The modeled portion of the Doo Line is set in West Virginia in 1968.

Dave is our Division 10 Achievement Program Chairman. He has also been active in the Bluegrass Railroad club for many years, where he has been on the board of directors and a program chairman. He also enjoys building model cars and airplanes, wood working, Habitat for Humanity and cruising in his vintage Corvette.

Resistance Soldering Follow-on:

(From Mike Baskette) Herbach and Rademan Company, www.herbach.com has a transformer and several foot switches. On page 46 of their current on-line catalog is: Item # TM98XFR3247: this is a 360 watt transformer with output voltages between 0.5 and 46.5 VAC. This is plenty of low voltage/high current range to power a soldering tip for various conditions. Price \$24.95. Also, on page 50 of the same is a nice selection of foot switches ranging in price from \$8.70 to \$39.00 and rated from 7 to 20 AMPS.

Background Buildings Tip:

Before assembling a building kit, but after painting the desired facade, place it face down on a scanner, with black paper behind it, and scan it into your PC, then edit the color and size if desired, print it out on heavy stock, and you have a "free" background building!


