## Minutes From Last Meeting | JACK PSCHERER & STEVE ROSS |

The March meeting was called to order by Superintendent Jerry Kyslinger at 2:32 PM at the Ohio Valley Lines club in Ambridge, PA. A large number of members were present, most walking around the spacious layout, so it was difficult to get an accurate head count.

John Gallagher welcomed the members to the club's facilities. John also mentioned that the basement is being remodeled, and when it is finished the space will be used for an N Gauge layout. Further, the second floor is also undergoing some changes, and future meetings will be held upstairs. Rich Kuroski, a long time NMRA member but new to the Division introduced himself.

The February meeting minutes were approved as published in the Flyer.

Tom Gaus and Jack Pscherer counted the ballots for the 2008 election of officers. Seventy ballots were received; Susan Werner succeeds Jerry Kyslinger as Superintendent and Mike Hohn becomes the new Assistant Superintendent.

The Treasurer's report was given by Jerry in Carl Volkwein's absence, income was \$772 and expenses were \$372 for a net profit of \$400.

Dick Flock gave the Company Store update. Several new books are available; PRR Trackside with John Dziobko, Jr., 1951-1961; Pennsylvania Lines West; and several new Kalmbach Publishing Co. books in their how-to series. Dick also mentioned his trip to the War Memorials in Washington D.C. is scheduled for April 16. The cost is \$65 per person, open to everyone, and includes lunch and dinner.

Tom Gaus, Membership Chair and Webmaster, reported the Division stands at 263 members. The website is very active with 16,000+ hits, 981 sessions, and the links page was the most viewed.

Bob Meier gave the FreeMo modular layout update. In addition to participating at the Greenberg Great Train and Toy Expo, July 12-13, at the Pittsburgh Expo Mart by Monroeville Mall, he is developing plans for a meeting this October. Details need to be finalized with the new administration.

# Bring 'n' Brag

March's contest was held at the Ohio Valley Lines club in Ambridge, PA. There were 12 entries consisting of 34 models in this month's contest where the subject was "Open Hopper cars."

First place was won by Jim Kubanick for his three HO scale hopper cars. The first model was of a USRA 70 ton design built from a Westerfield flat resin kit of a modernized car which eliminated the center clamshell hopper and retrofitted with AB brakes. Jim's second entry was an Illinois Central car based on the AAR 1935 standard. This car was built from a Sunshine resin kit. His third model was of a rebuilt Lehigh Valley hopper car built from an old Hobbyline kit. All three cars were expertly painted and lettered by Jim.

Second place went to Keith Devault for his set of four HO scale Chessie System hopper cars. All were built from plastic kits and were weathered with a mixture of paint and chalks

Third place was won by Allan Cybak for his collection of five 34' HO scale hopper cars painted and lettered for the Erie railroad. Allan renumbered all the cars, added Kadee couplers and metal wheels, and custom made loads from real coal.

Other entries for this month's contest included:

Mike Hohn entered two HO scale cars lettered for the

Lehigh Valley kitbashed from Athearn kits. One car had new sides laminated over it to simulate a fishbelly design car while the second car had external braces added to an offset side car to match the prototype.

Dick Flock entered an HO scale 55 ton hopper car built from the Tichy kit, detailed, painted and lettered for the PRR.

Steve Raque entered an HO scale 70 ton hopper car built from a Stewart kit and lettered for the P&LE using decals from Shenango Shops, Champ, and Microscale.

Eric Hansmann entered a set of 5 HO scale hopper cars built for Bowser, Stewart and Accurail kits and lettered for an assortment. Eric added prototypically correct details and replaced molded on grabirons and handholds with wire replacements.

Jim Dodds entered two HO scale hopper cars with custom built coke loads.

Susan Werner entered an HO scale USRA hopper car lettered for the P&W, which she lightly weathered with chalks.

Andy Lorince entered three S scale hopper cars, which he modified with prototypical details for scale.

Jim Whipple entered several S scale offset side twin hopper cars rebuilt and detailed from American Flyer shells.

Steve Ross entered two HO scale USRA hopper cars built from Accurail kits.




The meeting was adjourned at 3:22 PM. John Gallagher presented a program on restoration of an old model of a basic oxygen furnace and strip mill.






