



MCR PRESIDENT'S REPORT SPRING, 2025

The Mid Central Region of the NMRA encompasses twelve divisions which are functioning very well. Membership is relatively stable over the Covid era downturn, with overall membership approaching 1300. Some Divisions have seen a slight membership decline, while others, especially those with vibrant recruitment and retention activities have experienced a slight increase. In general, monthly attendance at local meetings and meets number 35 to 40 percent of total Division membership. Activities include modeling clinics, sometimes hosted by zoom from clinicians outside the Division or even the Region. Contests and 'bring and brag' are popular, as is sharing and discussion of specific modeling opps and problems, which keeps the attending members engaged in conversation. Many members within each Division are actively engaged in pursuit of the Achievement program. Most Divisions have conducted meets for the public during the past holiday season with modular layouts in several scales, including the newer T-trak. Attendance and appreciation by the public has been good as the hobby has been promoted, open resulting in signing up new members; however retention has been spotty beyond the six month trial membership. Revenues generated during many of these events have helped Divisions remain financially stable. Concerns throughout all Divisions in the region involve gaining younger members as well as seniors, member retention, and succession planning of Division officers and committee chairs.

A Weekend of Inspiration and Fellowship

Last month, model railroaders from across the Mid-Central Region gathered in Dublin, Ohio, for the NMRA MCR 2025 Buckeye Express Convention, and what an unforgettable weekend it was. From the moment the doors opened on Thursday afternoon at the Embassy Suites Hotel, you could feel the electric buzz of excitement in the air.





Whether you're a seasoned prototype modeler, a newcomer eager to learn the ropes, or simply someone who loves trains, this year's convention offered something for everyone. As we look forward to the Whistle-Stop Dayton 2026 convention, allow me to share some of the highlights and memorable experiences that made Buckeye Express such a success – and why you'll want to be in Dayton next June.

The convention kicked off with a warm welcome from our Division 6 hosts, who did an outstanding job coordinating dozens of clinics, layout tours, and other events. Registration lines moved swiftly, thanks to a team of volunteers in bold red shirts. Every attendee received a bag loaded with details about the convention and local tourist information, and a name badge on a lanyard. Once checked in at registration, many went to the company store to either set up or to see what was available, while others simply mingled and greeted friends that haven't been seen in a while.



Clinics: Learning from the Best

On of the cornerstones of any NMRA convention is the clinic program, and the Buckeye Express did not disappoint. Over 30 clinics ran throughout the weekend, covering topics from basic scenery techniques to advanced DCC programming. Here are a few examples:

- "Operations 101" by Mike Wolf, MMR: At Mike's clinic, attendees were introduced to the world of operations in model railroading. He covered the essential lingo and fundamentals before moving into the specifics of developing an operating scheme, handling car forwarding, scheduling trains, and dispatching and controlling movements. Participants also learned how to assemble and train an effective ops crew. Whether you were adapting your layout for operations or preparing for your first operating session, this clinic provided everything you needed to get started.
- "Modeling Oil Fields and Railroads in Southeast Ohio" by Greg Short: At Greg's clinic, attendees explored the history of oil and gas production and examined the recent boom in Southeast Ohio. He detailed how railroads have supported this vital industry over the years, outlining the specific operations in the region's oil and gas fields and the specialized equipment railroads deployed to serve these customers.

"Using Neat Tools to Build Your Models" by Randy Allio, MMR: During Randy's session, attendees explored an array of model-building implements he's come to rely on. He guided participants through tools suited for crafting scenery, detailing rolling stock, and erecting scale structures. A standout demonstration featured his Cricut cutter, used to fashion precise parts from styrene, sheet-wood, cardstock, and vinyl. To close the clinic, everyone had the chance to handle several of these tools hands-on.



Home Layout Tours: A Glimpse into Central Ohio Railroading

One of the true joys of an NMRA convention is the opportunity to visit private layouts, and this year The Buckeye Express delivered a diverse selection. Here are just a few:

• "C&O Columbus" by Dick Argo: This HO layout is modeled after the C&O Railroad in Columbus, which he spent time working on. One of the features was the Ohio State Penitentiary, which you don't see every day on a layout.



• "Norfolk & Western Scioto Valley Division" by Matt Goodman: Matt's layout focuses on his hometown of Circleville, Ohio in 1938. The layout is still under construction with many interesting features including a fourteen-foot-long slide-out staging yard.



• "Olive Grove TT. & Lumber Co." by Howdy Lamprecht, MMR: This is a fictional layout featuring the logging town of Olive Grove in Montana. The town can only be reached by switchback, with Shays running loads on the hill.



Operating Sessions: Bringing a Layout to Life

An operating session is a chance to join friends at a local model railroad layout and run the trains. Your host will first give you a guided tour of the layout, pointing out all the key locations and procedures—then assign you your very first train to operate. Many layouts even feature working signals and dispatchers, so you'll experience prototypical operations firsthand. It's an incredibly fun way to bring a layout to life!


Local Attractions: If You Need a Break from Trains

Who am I kidding? We don't really need a break from trains, but when the family comes along to the convention, exploring the local sights is a great way to discover what the area has to offer—and to spend some quality time together.

Some of the attractions that were featured at the Buckeye Express were the Columbus Zoo, Center of Science and Industry (COSI), the Jack Nicklaus Museum, and the Nation Veterans Memorial and Museum.

T-Trak

This year at the Buckeye Express, the sole layout on display was a T-Trak N-scale modular setup. Participants brought their own modules—most two-foot doubles—that snapped together to form an expansive layout. Under Bruce DeMaeyer's coordination, the assembly was swift, and once powered up, the layout ran flawlessly.





Company Store, Yard Sales, and Raffle

Nestled in the back corner of the hotel was the Company Store room, where attendees could purchase convention merchandise—this year's highlight being some excellent HO rolling stock.

The same space also hosted the yard-sale area for gently used layout items. If you're ready to part with something from your own layout, bring it in so fellow hobbyists can browse— and potentially buy—it. The Company Store retains a 10% commission on all sales.

Finally, the Raffle takes place in the Company Store room. After you've purchased your raffle tickets, drop them into the container in front of the prize you'd like to win. If your number is drawn, you get to walk away with that prize.



Model Contest and Photo Competition

No NMRA convention is complete without the contest room. Many great examples of locomotives, rolling stock, and dioramas were on display. These were judged by a panel of volunteer AP evaluators.

The photo competition ran in parallel, with categories for color and monochrome shots, roster shots, and prototype scenery.

Prizes for the winners were given out at the Awards Banquet.

Awards Banquet

Saturday's Awards Banquet capped off the weekend on a high note. Registrants gathered for a plated dinner, choosing between top sirloin steak, grilled salmon, or eggplant parmesan. Included were honey glazed carrots, herb-roasted red potatoes, and chocolate cake for dessert. During dinner a wonderful slideshow was displayed showing fun photographs from all the events that happened at the convention.

The keynote speaker that evening was Stu Nicholson of the Rail Passengers Association. Stu spoke in depth about why developing passenger rail service is so important for Ohio's residents and visitors—and why it holds such appeal for model railroaders.

Following the keynote address, Susan Werner *MMR* presented the contest plaques and encouraged more entrants to participate next year—so get started now to ensure you have something ready to submit!

As the Buckeye Express convention ended, there was a palpable sense of accomplishment – and a tinge of reluctance to leave. Whether you came for the clinics, the layouts, the contests, or simply to reconnect with longtime friends, you left invigorated with new ideas and a fresh motivation for your next modeling project. The success of the Buckeye Express is a testament to the dedication of the Division 6 volunteers and vibrant passion of the MidCentral Region members.

Now it is time to turn our attention to Whistle-Stop Dayton 2026, scheduled for June 4-7 at the Marriott at University of Dayton. 
